



FISHING RULES

The rules are designed to ensure sustainable fishing for future generations. Large predatory fish such as pike, zander and the slightly smaller perch help to keep order among the whitefish population, such as roach and bream. This contributes positively to the water network's ecosystem by reducing eutrophication, which is now a major problem in Stockholm and Mälardalen. Join in and help ensure good fishing today and in the future by:

- putting back the fish that are below or exceed the dimensions
- respect the maximum number that may be fished

By keeping a fishing license, you benefit fish monitoring and fish management, which aims to promote fish stocks throughout the municipality. For more information on purchasing a fishing licence: www.ifiske.se

It is the angler's responsibility to be familiar with the boundaries. When fishing from land, the right of public access applies; thus clearly private plots may not be entered. Waterside fishing inspections are regularly performed by fishing inspectors appointed by the County Board. Violations of the regulations and breaches of the Fisheries Act (1993:787) will be reported to the police and fishing equipment may be seized if deemed necessary.

- Fishing is only permitted with a valid fishing licence.
- The fishing licence must be carried whenever fishing and shown upon request to the fishing inspector.

- Fish may only be taken for private use and may not be sold.
- A maximum of three predatory fish (pike and zander) may be taken on any one fishing day.
- Perch over 35 cm shall be released. A maximum of five perch may be taken on any one fishing day.
- The size limits for pike and zander are 45-70 cm (i.e. you may not take fish that are larger or smaller than these measurements).
- Asp and eel, without exception, are to be released following capture.
- Only angling, using a fishing rod, spinning rod or fly rod, and jigging, ice-fishing and trolling are allowed.
- For fishing with bait, members may use a (1) bait net or a (1) fabric keep net. Keep nets must be clearly labelled with name, telephone number and fishing licence number.
- When ice-fishing, a maximum of five rods may be used.
- For other types of fishing, a maximum of two rods per angler may be used.
- Crayfish fishing is not covered by the fishing licence.
- Fishing is prohibited in all running water from 1st April to 31st May.
- Fishing is prohibited in the Väsbyån watercourse in its entirety.
- The use of petrol motors is prohibited on (Lake) Edssjön.
